Awards

- Discussion on the survey results
 - De-Nian discussed the highlights of the survey. It was good to see that we have been already working on a journal special issue as this was one of the highly recommended future topics by the TC members for the TC to work on.
 - Vincent Chan mentioned presenting misinformation and cyberbullying in social networks is an important topic that technical folks should consider working with policymakers. He mentioned that lawyers, judges learn from the books and they have much less experience with social networks, so it is new territory for them. He mentioned that we should get in touch with Linda Doyle from Trinity College Dublin in Ireland as well as Dimitra Simeonidou from the University of Bristol in the UK.
 - Damla mentioned that the social aspects of AR/VR are exciting and it is a new topic from the networking research as well. Raju Venkataramana agreed that GE would be interested in partnering on this topic.

Digital mentorship

- Ask Eirini, check AESS, Networking Women (Damla).
- Vincent Chan suggests organizing a panel in a conference as he strongly believes that mentoring is essential and the junior faculty and industry partners will continue the work of the technical committees.
- Stefano Galli asked Neeli to share her ideas about the digital mentorship in a quick summary. We might be one of the few committees looking at mentorship idea although there are still several upcoming committee meetings.
- De-Nian will update the website with digital mentorship.

<u>Others</u>

Stefano Galli asked whether we have a good conference on social networks outside IEEE and if so, we could collaborate or acquire related conferences.

- Neeli was thinking that we could organize workshops in other conferences such as IEEE WCNC, VTC, etc.
- Neeli was suggesting to invite senior and/or junior faculty to give short technical presentations in our TC meetings.
- Neeli mentioned that we need to aim to keep our submissions at least 50-60 papers. De-Nian mentioned that we had fluctuations in the submissions. Eirini added that we had 26 submissions in GC'20 but it turns out it is not considered low within the GC20 SAC.
- Neeli suggested that we should consider organizing a panel with industry and academia to discuss research opportunities for social VR/AR from the perspective of the industry.
- Neeli suggested that we should consider summer/winter schools.
